I'M HEARING GOOD THINGS

The truth is I'm hearing good things. I'm hearing good things about what Riverside does well. I'm hearing good things about what you tell me you want to see improved. I'm hearing good things about what you are dreaming about for your church's future. I'm hearing good things and I can't wait to tell you the details in a few months. I hope you hear that as good news today.

Now, I mentioned earlier that I have good news *and* bad news. I think we all recognize that there is always some bad news in the world and we don't have to go too far to find it. So here is what I think – the good news is that, because of Jesus, the bad news is overcome by the Good News! As the hymn writer put it, "Though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the ruler yet." ([This is My Father's World](#)) In the Gospel (The Good News), Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) I hope you hear that as good news today.

Life Saving Outreach

LIVING WATER TRIP – On Sunday, June 25, Riverside’s team traveled to Managua, Nicaragua. Our team: Gwen McCartt, Sean McCartt, Dael Clark, Eric England and his father, Mike England, from Illinois, Dan Bremer, Melissa Buller and her sister, Abby Buller, of Nashville, Liz Easton and Collin Easton.

They went to La Ceiba, a community about an hour and half outside of Managua. The community members were waiting for our team and were very welcoming. The Mayor gathered everyone together and opened in prayer – it was very moving.

On that first day they were able to drill 180 feet with no glitches – it was amazing! The women on the hygiene team taught classes to the women and the children of the community on hand washing, brushing teeth, proper nutrition and also how to use and store their clean water. They also had bible studies – including the woman at the well, the parable of the lost sheep, and the house built on the rock. Some of the drill team members came to help act out the bible stories which the children loved!

By the end of the week our team had a 150 foot well with clean water and many amazing relationships that they will never forget. The community said they were forever grateful that Living Water was able to provide them with clean water – and we will be forever grateful for the memories and many blessings we received from the people of La Ceiba. It was a wonderful week.

RUMC 2017 FINANCIAL STATUS

June YTD Giving:	\$315,100
June YTD Need:	<u>\$353,700</u>
Shortfall:	\$38,600

Our spending year to date (YTD) is below our budget; therefore the current shortfall is due to the timing of tithes and offering received. Over the last four years, giving to the general fund has tended to be more favorably weighted to the last three months of the year.

Because our spending tends to occur evenly throughout the year, we have been running deficits for much of the year. Our June YTD deficit is the second highest of the preceding four years. Though we are not alarmed, we wanted to communicate our current financial situation. We are blessed to currently have unspent (but committed) reserve funds to cover this deficit temporarily.

I invite you to review your financial commitment to see if it is “on pace”. We are grateful for the generosity of this congregation with its time, talents and treasure so that the Kingdom of God might be made present to as many as possible.

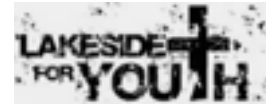
